

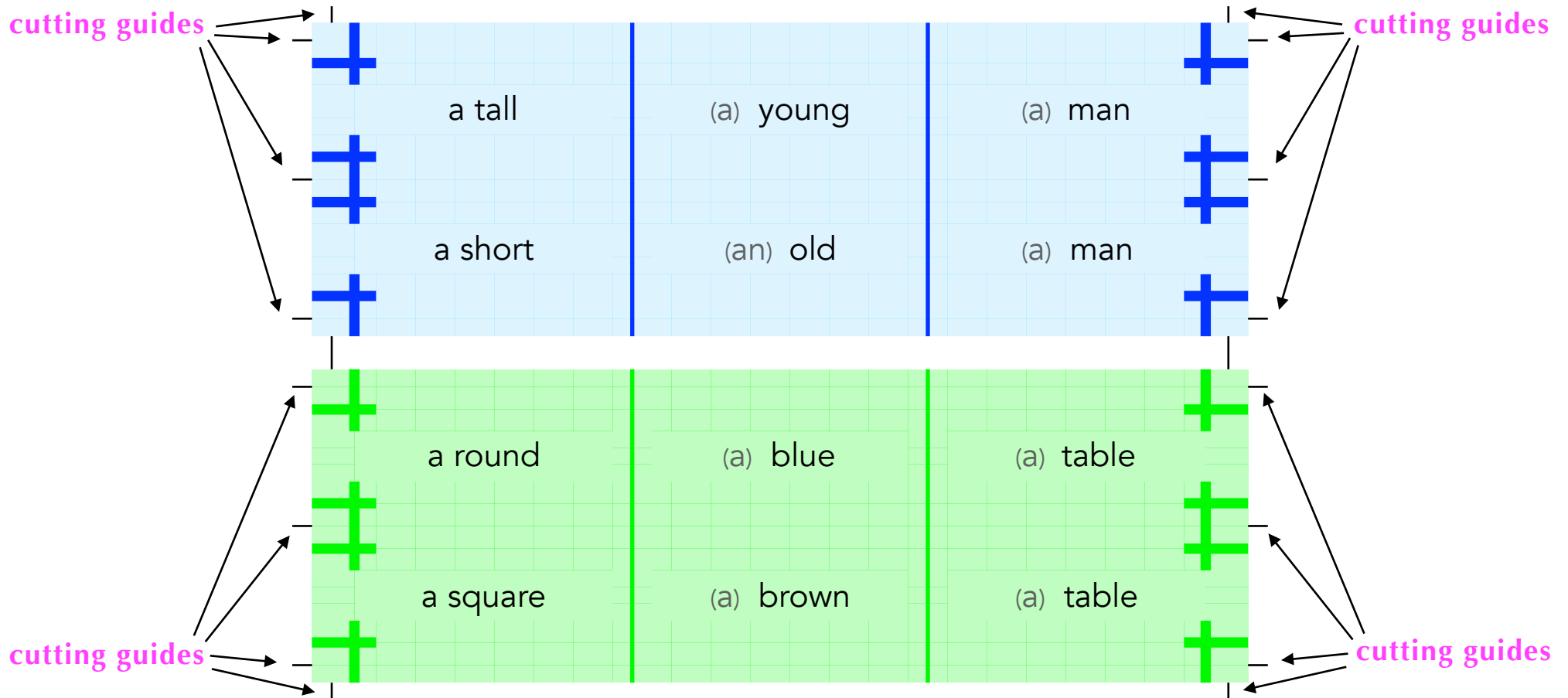

# PRINTING AND CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

This PDF contains printable pages for making strips for a game called ... **Adjective Order Strips**.

I recommend printing each page on sticky-back paper, then adhering the paper to a thick, stiff paper such as card board.

To cut the strips, simply follow the small black cut guides.
